## \*ARTIST IN RESIDENCE GRANT (AIR)

Applications are accepted year-round but must be submitted six weeks prior to project start date.

Artist in Residence is a noncompetitive reimbursement grant program that provides up to \$2,500 in support for North Dakota pre-K-12 students and teachers to work with professional artists either in a traditional school setting or during after-school and/or summer programs.

### \*ND AFTERSCHOOL: ARTS IN AFTERSCHOOL FUNDING

The ND Afterschool Network, in collaboration with ND Council on the Arts, is pleased to offer funding to ND afterschool and other out-of-school time programs to increase opportunities for students in grades K-12 to engage in arts programming during the 2022-2023 school year. Requested amount may range from \$500 - \$2,000. Connecting with your community is an important component to afterschool programming. Out-of-school time programs are encouraged to develop proposals that build or expand upon connections between afterschool programs, artists or arts organizations and community members.




## \*TINY PRINT PRESS PROJECT FOR SCHOOL/ELDER CARE PARTNERSHIPS

Does your school have an existing partnership with an Eldercare /service facility or organization or looking for an innovative and creative way for students and elders to collaborate and work together? If so, **CHECK THIS OUT!** 

North Dakota Council on the Arts' Art for Life Program in partnership with NDSU School of Design, Architecture and Art, as well as folk artists have created four unique sets of art kits with sequential skill-based art instruction videos accessible online for elders and children. Focusing on the practice of greeting card exchanges, this project includes an intergenerational component with schoolchildren who participate in the printmaking and card exchange with elders through such things as pen pal programs.

These kits will be provided free of charge to eldercare/service organizations and schools who can demonstrate established, ongoing relationships. **To learn more, watch:**

### \*POETRY OUT LOUD

As you begin your new school year, we once again invite all high school level students and teachers to participate in the ND Poetry Out Loud program, sponsored in all 50 states by The National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation. More than four million students have participated in *Poetry Out Loud* since 2005, many advancing from classroom competitions to school competitions to state competitions and ultimately to the national finals where students compete for the grand prize of \$20,000. In total, *Poetry Out Loud* awards more than \$100,000 to state- and national-level winners and their schools each year.

<u>Poetry Out Loud addresses most state ELA standards and can easily be integrated into existing curriculum.</u> By incorporating memorization and performance in the classroom, POL sets the stage for students to deepen their understanding of figurative language, word relationships and the nuances within word meanings. In addition, students learn about great poetry, explore their literary heritage, and gain confidence in public speaking skills.

This program and all resources are provided **FREE** to all participating schools. In addition, North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) in partnership with Humanities North Dakota offers funding to support poet visits to schools registered in the POL Program.



A total of \$14,000 is available for the 2022-23 school year. These funds will be allocated on a first-come first-serve basis. Total amount of request may not exceed \$2,000.
