North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) operates through the support of the National Endowment for the Arts and an appropriation from the North Dakota State Legislature. Approximately two-thirds of NDCA's budget is awarded to organizations and individuals through its various grant programs. In addition to the grant programs, NDCA also supports a biennial State Arts Conference and the biennial Governor's Awards for the Arts.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director (ED) is responsible for the implementation of NDCA's strategic vision and strategic plan which is renewed every five years. Due to the ED's role within State Government, he/she must reside in the Bismarck metro area. Aspects of the ED's role include:

- Champion policies and practices that empower a diverse, inclusive, and equitable state where cultural equity is visible to all.
- Clearly articulate and advocate for mission, vision, and strategic goals.
- · Demonstrate ethical leadership and fiscal stewardship.
- Testify biannually before the Legislature in support of budget and strategic plan with an understanding of state financial systems.
- Maintain deep understanding of the strengths and needs of North Dakota arts and have an understanding of, or familiarity, with Midwest culture.
- Act as the public face and voice for NDCA and a primary advocate for the arts in North Dakota.
- Professionally manage operations and assigned grant programs.
- Strong interpersonal communication skills.
- Communicate effectively with the NDCA board of directors, staff, and contractors.

RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

BE PART OF SOME BIGGER

- NDCA expanded its reach within and across the State through ongoing partnerships (Commerce/Main Street Initiative, Parks and Recreation, the State Heritage Center, Humanities ND, Prairie Public Broadcasting) and new programs with Native Cultural Organizations, Game and Fish, and the Department of Transportation. There is opportunity for growth in the development of strategic alliances with Health and Human Services; ND Department of Corrections; ND Natl. Guard/DOT/Tourism (Arts Across the Prairie); and regionally with Arts Midwest projects.
- Arts Across the Prairie: Placemaking in Rural North Dakota, NDCA's
 newest Statewide program was developed to celebrate the cultural
 heritage of rural areas, foster creative relationships across counties
 and regions, bolster NDCA's role as a rural development partner, and
 spur economic development through tourism. Furthermore, as a
 community-driven initiative, it aims to promote civic pride, affirm
 distinctiveness of place, and strengthen cultural identity. This
 program will create public-private partnerships throughout the state
 and will provide a national model of this type of creative
 placekeeping.
- NDCA reacted nimbly to COVID-19, granting (CARE/ARPA) almost 1/2 million dollars to ND citizens and adjusting program offerings to support all.
- New revenue has been brought to the State and the arts. In addition to Federal and COVID funds, with almost \$400,000 specifically for new programs.
 - FUTURE IS BRIGHT

- In the first 18 months of the current biennium, individuals and organizations in 69 communities received grant funding with impact often reaching beyond community borders. We have distributed \$1,950,539 to date through 330 unique grants across most ND counties. This includes 30 partnership grants that have a regional or statewide reach. In addition to state appropriations, we are federally funded by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) through an Annual Partnership Award. Our federal funding has increased over recent years positively impacting the agency's ability to serve the citizens of the state. This trend is very likely to continue regardless of leading political parties.
- Two Accessibility Convenings have been held online with record attendance, and grant funds have been allocated for a new grant program.
- NDCA has expanded its capacity for Arts in Education by providing ND Teachers with summer professional development workshops and partnering with several regional Educational Associations with arts programs for after-school attendees and youth in the corrections system.
- Significant progress has been made toward NDCA's strategic goal of cultural equity, accessibility, inclusion, and reaching communities traditionally underserved by the arts. A REACH (DEI) committee has been formed and is poised to make great strides.

OTHER NORTH DAKOTA GEMS...

FARGO

The vibrant downtown offers unique lodging, eating establishments, breweries, theaters and entertainment venues and the metro area has several college and active art communities. There is an impressive range of museums, which include the <u>Fargo Air Museum</u>, <u>Bonanzaville</u> pioneer village, <u>Plains Art Museum</u>, <u>Roger Maris Museum</u> (in honor of the legendary New York Yankees baseball player).

BOTTINEAU

Bottineau is a four-season playground located at the foot of the Turtle Mountains near the International Peace Garden and the U.S.-Canadian border. Nearby is the inspiring Mystical Horizons, the "Stonehenge of the Prairie" on the edge of the Turtle Mountain. Bottineau also is a short ride from Lake Metigoshe, Bottineau Winter Park ski and snowboard area and the Turtle Mountain Scenic Byway.

DICKINSON

Dickinson is the western end of Old Red Old Ten Scenic Byway, which ends at the eastern hub in Mandan. The Killdeer Mountain Four Bears Scenic Byway begins just north of Dickinson on Highway 22. Cultural activities in and around Dickinson include Roughrider Days Fair and Expo, Badlands Art Gallery, Bandshell Concert Series, Badlands Ukrainian Days (Belfield, ND), Dickinson Museum Center, and the Ukrainian Cultural Institute.
