North Dakota Council on the Arts Announces the Winners of the 2016 Poetry Out Loud State Finals

The North Dakota Council on the Arts is pleased to announce Caroline Huber of Minot High School, Magic City Campus, as the 2016 State Champion and first place winner of the North Dakota State *Poetry Out Loud: National Recitation Contest.* Zach Howatt of Northern Cass High School received second place honors. Placing third was Emily Schmidt of Mandan High School. Caroline Huber will advance to the National Finals in Washington, DC on May 2-4, 2016, where a total of \$50,000 in cash and school stipends will be awarded. This year's North Dakota Poetry Out Loud State Finals competition took place on Monday, March 14, at the North Dakota Heritage Center in Bismarck, ND.

Provided in partnership with The National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), the Poetry Foundation, and North Dakota Council on the Arts, *Poetry Out Loud* is a national arts education program that encourages the mastery of great poetry by offering educational materials and a dynamic competition to high schools across the country. *Poetry Out Loud* uses a pyramid structure. Beginning at the classroom level, winners advance to the school-wide competition, then to the state competition, and ultimately to the National Finals in Washington, DC.

At the school, state, and national competitions, contestants recite works selected from an anthology of more than 400 classic and contemporary poems. The NEA and Poetry Foundation provide support materials for classroom instruction, including a standards-based teacher's guide, a comprehensive website, and a CD featuring poetry recitations by well-known actors and writers such as Anthony Hopkins, Alyssa Milano, N. Scott Momaday, and Rita Dove.

Emcee Elizabeth Gross, First Lady Betsy Dalrymple, *Poetry Out Loud* Coordinator Rebecca Engelman, and special guest Andi Mathis from the NEA, presented the awards to the participants. All participating contestants received a \$20 book store gift card and a certificate of participation. Each lead teacher received a participation certificate. First place winner Caroline Huber received a trophy, medallion, \$200, plus an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, DC. Caroline's school, Minot High, will also receive a \$500 stipend for the purchase of poetry books and the honor of displaying the POL Traveling Trophy. Second place winner Zach Howatt received a trophy, medallion, \$100, plus \$200 for his school library. Third place winner Emily Schmidt received a trophy, and medallion.
